

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Letter From the Chief Development Officer





We cannot wait to share all of the exciting things still to come. In the meantime, I hope you have taken a drive past the new campus to see the progress firsthand or taken one of our virtual tours of the site, which you can access through the QR code below. I'm thrilled to announce that the Auxiliary will host the 75th annual Valley Ball at the new hospital on Friday, October 27, 2023, and invite you to join us for this preview before the doors open for patient care. A once-in-alifetime event deserves equally superb entertainment, which is why we have booked Max Weinberg (Bruce Springsteen's drummer) and his band for the celebration. Keep an eye out for ticket information and additional details to be shared soon!

With so much to look forward to in 2023, I also wanted to share some accomplishments that closed out a successful 2022. After almost a three-year drought of in-person activities, the Foundation held 21 events where people could interact face to face. This provided a tremendous boost to our ability to meet new people and was instrumental in helping us to raise \$13.4 million for the year, bringing our campaign total to \$110 million! Donor support of the *Serve. Care. Transform.* campaign continued to fuel our efforts to construct the new hospital, with more than 4,600 gifts, including several leadership gifts over \$1 million for the year. Meanwhile, at the Ridgewood hospital, Valley reached a milestone

with the birth of the 4,000th newborn at our Center for Childbirth. Never in Valley's 71 years have we welcomed more babies into the world in a single year!

In this issue, we feature stories of Valley physicians giving to the campaign. They have long been philanthropic partners in helping the hospital move forward: assisting in building new facilities, advancing research, and creating new programs. When plans were announced for The Valley Hospital in Paramus, our most ambitious project to date, their response was eager and immediate. A medical staff fundraising goal of \$1 million was quickly surpassed and surpassed once again when it was raised to \$3 million. Now it stands at \$5 million, and we look forward to breaking through that level with this group of dedicated and hardworking individuals. As always, we are grateful for their commitment and support.

Fakharzadeh Family Makes Memorial Gift in Support of Campaign

Since arriving at Valley in 1987, Frederick (Fred) Fakharzadeh, M.D. has had a front-row seat to the hospital's growth and transformation. "When I started, the operating rooms were on the 2nd floor of the Phillips building, before moving to their current location," he explains. Another big change came in 2002 with the opening of the Luckow Pavilion, Valley's same-day surgery center. "As a hand surgeon, it's where I've done the majority of my cases for over 20 years. It's another tremendous facility that has been great for both patients and doctors," he says. It's from the dictation suite at Luckow that he has watched The Valley Hospital in Paramus, just across Winters Avenue, come to life.

During a recent tour of the new hospital site, the longtime Valley physician couldn't help but think of the future. "You can see how the facility is built for flexibility and how we are going to be able to optimize patient care – it's just amazing," he says with a smile. "To have had the opportunity to go 'behind the scenes' and get a full picture of the planning process and see how it's all getting made, I'm just incredibly grateful."

Raised in Teaneck and a resident of Oradell, he has served patients in the community for 36 years. For Dr. Fakharzadeh, Valley is also where his own loved ones have received care, including his father, Mehdi. "My dad was in the life insurance industry with MetLife for 60 years and didn't retire until he was 91," he says. His father touched so many lives that Dr. Fakharzadeh describes more than one occasion when, noticing the name on his badge, someone in an elevator at the hospital would ask if he was related to Mehdi Fakharzadeh. "He loved what he did. Loved going to work every day and loved his clients. He really was so committed," he says proudly. In his father's later years, visits to Valley became more frequent. "It's never easy, but I knew he was receiving care from my colleagues, who treated him as family. It's what makes Valley so special."

Mehdi Fakharzadeh passed away in 2019; in his honor, the Fakharzadeh family has chosen to make a Leadership gift to the campaign for the new hospital and name the outdoor terrace in his memory. "My father always had an affinity and high regard for the medical field, and he was also always one to dream big. Combine that with the wonderful experience he had at Valley and our desire to be part of the campaign, and it all jelled for us to make this gift." The terrace, Dr. Fakharzadeh explains, was a perfect choice. "Not only did my father love gardening, but he would have loved that this will be an area of the hospital that can be enjoyed by everyone."

When reflecting on his father's legacy, he comes back to the idea of family. "My parents instilled in us that if you are in a position to help, at any level, it's something you should do," he says. "To think about what this new hospital means for the community and for our Valley family, my family is grateful to be a part of it."

Mittals' Generous Gift to Support Electrophysiology Services at New Hospital

"We made a gift to the campaign as a sign of our commitment to all patients receiving care at Valley and to the new hospital project," explains Suneet Mittal, M.D., Director of Valley's Electrophysiology Program and Associate Chair of Cardiology.

Since joining Valley in 2011, Dr. Mittal has been an integral member of cardiovascular services, conducting world-class clinical research and pioneering innovative treatments and procedures with colleagues: "Throughout my career at Valley, I have been fortunate to work alongside some of the most dedicated, accomplished, and considerate clinicians while spearheading cutting-edge initiatives," he says, reflecting on the last 12 years in Ridgewood.

This has included establishing the Snyder Center for Comprehensive Atrial Fibrillation in 2015, where Dr. Mittal works with the region's leading team of doctors specializing in treating heart rhythm abnormalities. There his

accomplishments have included launching Al–related initiatives like Deep6 Al, which uses sophisticated machine learning to screen electronic medical records to identify patients who may be best suited for either clinical or research-based interventions.

"We have a robust cardiovascular program at Valley that is known for its depth of experience and multidisciplinary team approach to care," Dr. Mittal says. "What the new facility in Paramus allows us to do is take advantage of that team-based care and provide an even better experience for our patients and families." Having toured the site recently with his colleagues, he was amazed. "What I saw that day is something that is well-equipped to carry us for decades going forward. Just the size and scope of the new hospital will allow us to head into 2030 and beyond without any restrictions."

Suneet and his wife, Deepti, have chosen to direct their campaign gift to support electrophysiology services at the new hospital and have offered to match gifts from grateful patients and supporters up to \$100,000. They hope that their contribution along with that of others will help the electrophysiology program continue to achieve its stated mission "to deliver evidence-based, patient-centered, team-directed healthcare."

MRI Suite in Paramus to Be Named in Honor of Thomas F. McGuire, M.D.

"Tom was a great physician, a real gentleman, and most importantly, very kind," Jack Maun, M.D. remembers. Thomas F. McGuire, M.D. was born in the Bronx in 1938 and served as a commissioned officer in the United States Army. A graduate of New York Medical College, he completed a residency in internal medicine before going on to specialize

in radiology. The late Valley physician was a founding member of Radiology Associates of Ridgewood, a partner to the hospital since 1970.

Before his passing, Dr. McGuire generously arranged for an estate gift to The Valley Hospital Foundation of more than \$1 million, ensuring that his personal commitment to the hospital continues. In appreciation of his long esteemed career, the MRI Suite will be named in his honor at The Valley Hospital in Paramus.

Valley Signs Monumental Environmental Pledge

Valley Health System has joined over 800 U.S. hospitals and thousands of other organizations across the country in signing the Health Sector Climate Pledge. In partnership with the White House, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services developed this initiative to mobilize the U.S. healthcare sector in driving down greenhouse emissions, improving the environment, and helping focus industry response to climate challenges. In addition to reducing their carbon footprint, signatories also commit to producing detailed plans to prepare their facilities for both chronic and acute catastrophic climate impacts.

Valley has specifically pledged to, at minimum, reduce organizational emissions by 50% by 2030 and achieve net zero by 2050; publicly report on progress; designate an executive-level lead for their work; conduct an inventory of Scope 3 (supply chain) emissions by the end of 2024; and develop and release a climate resilience plan for continuous operations by the end of 2023. More than 1,080 federal and private sector hospitals have made such commitments, together representing over 15% of U.S. hospitals.

For many years, Valley's long-standing commitment to sustainability has been recognized by national organizations, including Practice Greenhealth, the nation's leading organization dedicated to environmental sustainability in healthcare. In Paramus, sustainability has been a key guiding principle for the construction of Valley's new hospital. The campus will include a cogeneration plant that will produce anywhere from 35%-45% of the building's power; as a result, Valley anticipates about 9,000 tons in carbon emissions reduction. Valley also anticipates that the new hospital will achieve gold-level status for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification in several categories, including space usage, water conservation, and use of natural light.
