

I thank Valley's anonymous donor for making this possible and want all to know that I am humbled by this incredible gesture."

Though Audrey's professional achievements are many, her most significant legacy to Valley is the planning, design, financing, and building of Valley's new campus and state-of-the-art hospital that opened in Paramus in April 2024.

During a December 2024 dedication ceremony, Audrey also announced her plans to retire at the end of January 2025. A portrait of Audrey, painted by portrait artist Paul Jannis through a gift from the Valley Health System Board of Trustees, was also shared for the first time. Over her 45-year career with Valley, Audrey has held virtually every key executive leadership position in strategic planning, management, operations, and governance. She served as both the President and CEO of The Valley Hospital and Valley Health System for two decades.

We thank Audrey for her leadership of Valley through all these years and look forward to her continued friendship and service on The Valley Hospital Foundation Board of Trustees.



The Valley Hospital's Path to Paramus

January 2017

Elected officials and community leaders joined Valley Health System to announce plans to build a new, state-of-the-art hospital on Winters Avenue in Paramus. The new hospital would be the focal point of a 40-acre health and wellness campus that would transform healthcare in our region.



2017 - 2018

Valley frontline employees, medical staff, and ancillary team members were called upon to help design the new hospital through the unique 3P design process - Process, Preparation, and Production.



Spring 2020

The COVID-19 pandemic turned the world upside down and halted construction projects across the country. Luckily, Valley's careful planning and ordering of construction materials allowed Valley to avoid supply chain challenges that other organizations faced and continue progress on the state-of-the-art hospital.



December 2020

Valley Health System celebrated its "topping out" ceremony, a tradition in construction that celebrates a project reaching its highest point.



Many generous supporters signed the beam that would be raised to the construction project's highest point.



The Valley Hospital Foundation officially announced its \$125 million Serve. Care. Transform: The Next Chapter of The Valley Hospital campaign to build the new hospital in Paramus. The largest campaign in Valley's history, the campaign's success included 37 leadership gifts (over \$1 million) by the campaign's conclusion in 2024.

November 2019

Valley Health System broke ground at the site of the new hospital in Paramus. At the same time, a number of leadership supporters committed generous gifts toward Valley's future in Paramus. Valley's new hospital was on its way to becoming a reality.

July 2024

Valley launches its Graduate Medical Education (GME) program, welcoming its first class of residents in internal medicine and OB-GYN to Valley. The GME program will welcome its second class of residents and launch a surgical residency program in 2025.

12 December 2024

The Family Care Pavilion in The Valley Hospital in Paramus was officially dedicated in honor of Iong-time Valley President and CEO Audrey Meyers. The dedication, made possible by a generous gift from an anonymous donor, named the premier pavilion in Audrey's honor. During the ceremony, Audrey announced her retirement after 45 years of service to Valley. Read more on page 5.



March 2024

Joined by New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy, state and local legislators, Valley leadership and staff, as well as System and Foundation board members, Valley officially cut the ribbon on the new hospital, marking the ceremonial beginning of Valley's next chapter.

December 2024

The Valley Hospital Foundation concluded its Serve. Care. Transform. campaign on December 31, 2024. The campaign raised more than \$145 million toward the construc-

Now in its 81st year, the Valley Hospital Auxiliary has been a trusted partner of Valley Health System since before the Ridgewood Hospital was even built. The Auxiliary's 13 branches and more than 550 members made a pledge to the *Serve. Care. Transform.* campaign to raise \$3.1 million – \$3 million to establish the

pediatric section of the emergency department and \$100,000 to support *Butterflies*, Valley Home Care's pediatric home care and hospice program.

Auxilians volunteer their time in the hospital and host several popular fundraisers throughout the year, including the Annual Golf Outing, the Annual Sporting Clays Classic, the Tree of Light Illumination Ceremony, and of course, The Valley Ball.

Members of the Auxiliary recently presented a check for \$350,000 to The Valley Hospital Foundation and are on track to fulfill the remainder of their pledge in 2025.

Women For Health

Valley's Women For Health, a group of female philanthropists who pool their resources and select a worthy Valley program or service to fund each year, generously supported the Serve. Care. Transform. campaign. In 2020, the group's members voted to dedicate \$167,000 toward construction of The Valley Hospital in Paramus, and in appreciation for this gift, the new hospital's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit Family Lounge is named in honor of Women For Health and its members.

In addition, *Women For Health's* 2023 gift benefited efforts to improve the overall experience of mental health patients in the emergency department of the new hospital, and the group's 2024 gift benefited expanded staff education on care for LGBTQ+ patients throughout Valley Health System. *Women For Health's* total support during the campaign duration totaled nearly \$1 million.

As we celebrate this milestone, we also look ahead, identifying future needs and ways to provide the highest-quality, compassionate care to the people in our community who rely on us.

As we look to the future, Valley continues to invest in its people, facilities, technology, and services. Valley will continue to grow and expand its signature programs, ensuring the latest technologies and providing advanced care close to home.

In 2024, Valley launched a Graduate Medical Education program in collaboration with Mount Sinai's Icahn School of Medicine. Training the next generation of Valley physicians, the partnership resulted in Valley's first class of residents in internal medicine and OB-GYN, with a second class arriving in Summer 2025. In addition, Valley will launch its surgical residency program this year and plans to introduce additional specialties in the future.

Valley Medical Group continues to grow its medical practices and clinical services, making care even more accessible in local communities and meeting the evolving needs of patients in our region. Valley Home Care will continue to grow its services, caring for our region's growing aging population and others, and serving more than 12,000 patients annually.

In Ridgewood, the former hospital campus is transforming into an outpatient destination for our region. The Ridgewood campus houses Valley's outpatient diagnostic imaging center, the Valley Breast Center, physical medicine and rehabilitation, a full-service outpatient laboratory, the inpatient Wellness and Recovery Unit, and Valley's Earl A. Wheaton, Jr., M.D. Family Care Center, ensuring access to high-quality care for all who need it.

With space to add additional services as needed in the future, Valley's Ridgewood campus will continue to grow and thrive to meet our community's needs for years to come.

Philanthropy has been a cornerstone throughout Valley's history, from the early days before the Ridgewood hospital was built to the present day in Paramus. The generosity of our donors will continue to be critical in providing the high level of compassionate care for which Valley is known, and we are grateful for your ongoing support in Valley's next chapter.
